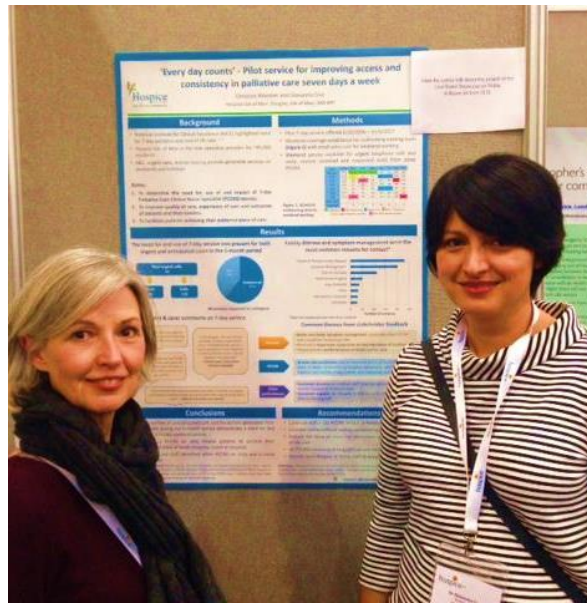

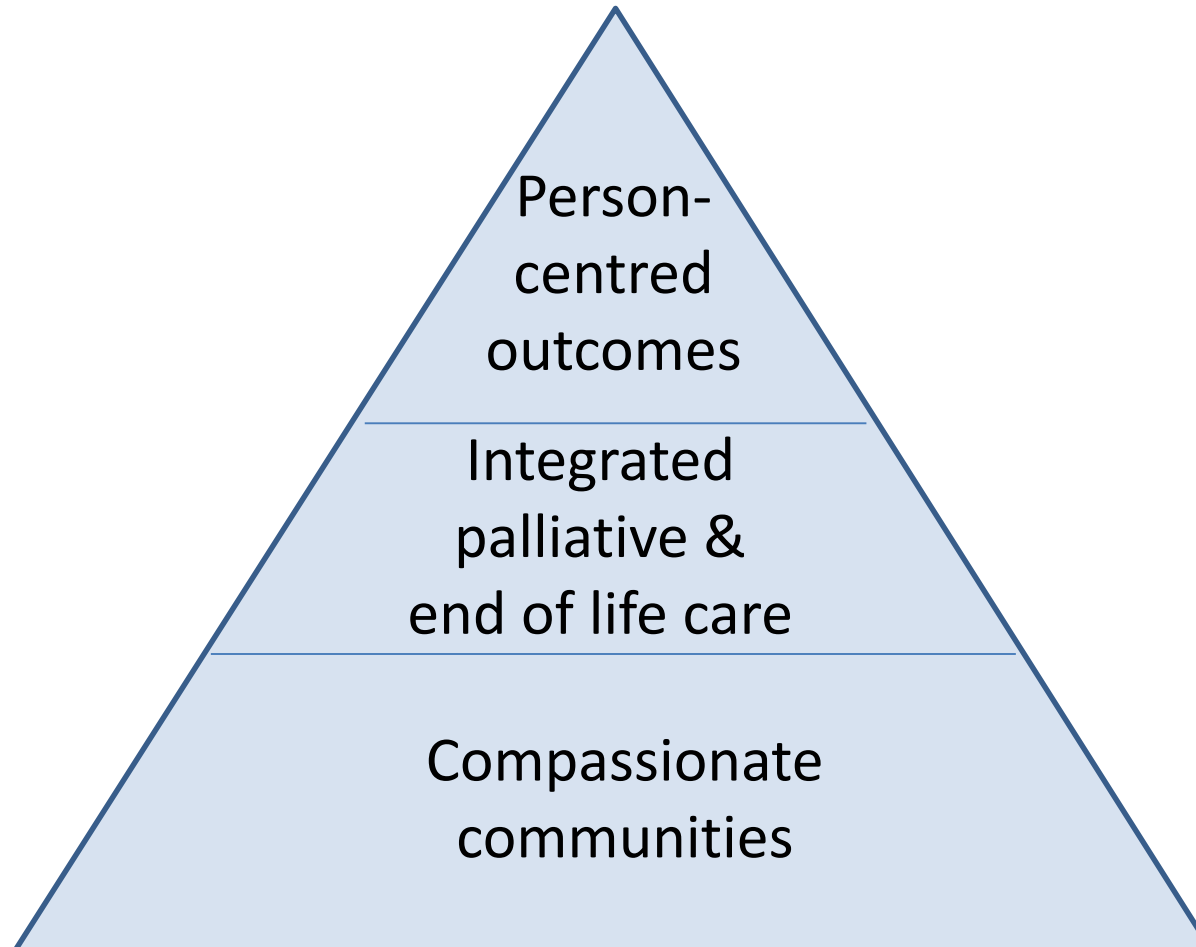
# Scholl Foundation 2018

# Identified current impacts

- Our needs assessment formed the basis of the Island Plan for Palliative and End of Life Care (September 2018)
- Our 'What matters to you' initiative was used as a basis of the Hospice Five Year Strategy (October 2018)
- Our evaluation of project ECHO and of end-of-life skills among staff will be used to enhance specialist training
- Our patient-centred outcome questionnaire has standardised Hospice outcome measurement
- Our 'patient diary project' has provided information on needs to inform the joint integrated care strategy





# Identified current impacts (continued)

- Our carers' survey is supporting development of carer support strategies
- We are supporting Hospice staff in their routine audits and specific evaluations of care
- We have been included as evaluators of the DHSC project in the west of the Island
- We have made links with Government departments to enhance Island information e.g. using registry data
- We are contributing to the Government's development of an overall research strategy for the Island
- We are developing international support for research, training and education in end of life care through the special interest group
